A Person Must Be in the Right Standing with God

God's moral law and commandments define what it means to be right with God.

1 Timothy 1:8-11

Problem: We Rebel Against God Rather than Obey His Standards

We all fall short of God's standards. Even if we did everything right moving forward, we could not correct our past misdeeds.

James 2:10

Solution: Jesus of Nazareth Solves the Problem Which We Cannot Solve Ourselves

Because we have fallen short of God's standards, we need Jesus' sacrifice on the cross to pay our ransom of guilt and to accept Jesus' offer of His righteousness to be accounted to us. Hence, it is as if we have done nothing wrong and have done everything according to God's standards.

2 Corinthians 5:21; 1 Corinthians 1:30

How do you accept Jesus' ransom and righteousness? You trust Him. You understand you are incapable of meeting God's standards on your own. You trust who Jesus is and what He has done for you; therefore, by accepting Jesus' death and resurrection on your behalf, you have a restored relationship with God. You are a new creation!

How do you know if it worked? The Holy Spirit comes upon you, along with other reasons, as a guarantee of your restored relationship with God (Ephesians 1:14). Through the working of the Holy Spirit, you feel conviction when you fall short of God's standards, and your desire is to be obedient to the will of God.

Authenticity of Jesus

- Jesus predicted and accomplished His own resurrection (Matthew 12:38-40; John 2:18:22)
- Jesus was proven to be God by the resurrection (Romans 1:4)
- Five hundred verifiable eyewitnesses to his resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:6)
- His followers never recanted but were beaten and martyred for their message (Act 5:40-42; 7:59-60)
